- Begin to use the *Six Historical Thinking Skills* in all grades (get our enews for training on these)
- Read Canadian historical fiction every year, regardless of topic of study
- Visit museums
- World history - History of Britain, France, Spain intersected history of Canada prominently

Note: Canadians receive very little Canadian content outside of social studies unlike our American neighbours. Traditional, classical, and Charlotte Mason method educators should include Canadian studies more often than suggested, preferably Canadian units yearly.
