Sagas about Viking visits to North America had been passed down by word-of-mouth for centuries until they were finally written down. The stories interested Norwegian explorer and writer, Helge Ingstad, who had been searching for possible Norse landing places along the Atlantic coast of North America.

With help of a local resident, he discovered some overgrown farms and ridges at Chesseaux Meadows, on the northernmost tip of Newfoundland. Then he and his wife, archaeologist Anne Stine Ingstad, led an international team in an eight-year excavation of the site. The discovery of artifacts and the remains of buildings led to the belief that Chesseaux Meadows is the site of a Viking village.




Norse sagas were oral traditions told and retold before being written down. They are a mix of primary sources and legend, for they are like exaggerated traveler's tales and therefore must be interpreted with these limitations in mind.

Observable facts are visible and concrete, while an interpretation is subjective, based on a collection of data and it must be open to new evidence and alternative opinions.

If all the world's a stage, British Columbia is one of its most dramatic sets. It is an ever-green, forested, mountain-rich, water-filled mountain domain. It is a land of abundance, opportunity and magnificence. Unsettled, restless and bold, it is a land for the young, the dreamers, those and for those who still seek a challenging life. It is an important land, free cultured, free wild, often foreign, sometimes angry, always active. Youngsters' describe it best.

The southern part of British Columbia was originally called Columbia, after the Columbia River. When it became a British colony in 1858, Queen Victoria named it British Columbia. On July 20, 1871, it became the sixth province to join the Dominion of Canada. Each province, a modern climate, and incredible scenery make this a paradise for many – the Promised Land.

Steller's Jay



Searching through the silence of the evergreen forest, is the noisy Steller's Jay protecting its nest, or warning of danger? Larger than the Blue Jay, the Steller's Jay can be 20-24 centimeters long. It is the only western jay with a peaked crest on its head. Foraging for pine seeds and acorns in tree trunks, it can also rob the eggs and young of small songbirds. Its all-purpose look can be serious, cocky, proud or just to match its food. Steller's Jays stay year-round in the coniferous forest ranging from the Pacific to the Rocky Mountains.

Pacific Dogwood



The Pacific Dogwood tree grows up to 18 meters high producing big white flowers in spring and red berries in autumn. The flowers' centers are yellow.

Economy

The economy of British Columbia is linked integrally to the forest industry since two-thirds of the province is forested. The generous rainfall and mild climate produce very tall, straight trees. More than 60% of Canada's lumber comes from British Columbia.


What do animals have to do with B.C.?

In 1915, animals were used to build the Canadian Trail over the summit of B.C.'s highest peak, still over 1000m.

The Prairies

Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba are called the prairie provinces. But, only the southern parts of these provinces lie within the true prairie.

The word "prairie" in French means meadow. A prairie is an open grassland with few trees. The land is mainly flat with some low, rolling hills. The Canadian prairies form the northern edge of a vast grassland that stretches south almost to the Gulf of Mexico.

The North American prairie region is in the middle of the continent, far from large bodies of water and blocked by mountains to the west. There is not enough rain to support trees, but grasses can survive the long, dry and often hot periods. So can hardy prairie flowers like daisies and violets.

For many centuries the prairie was home to the Aboriginal peoples who followed the great herds of bison across the grasslands. With the arrival of European settlers, the bison herds were destroyed and the native prairie grasses were replaced with grasses for cattle and grasses grown for grains.

The Tallgrass Prairie

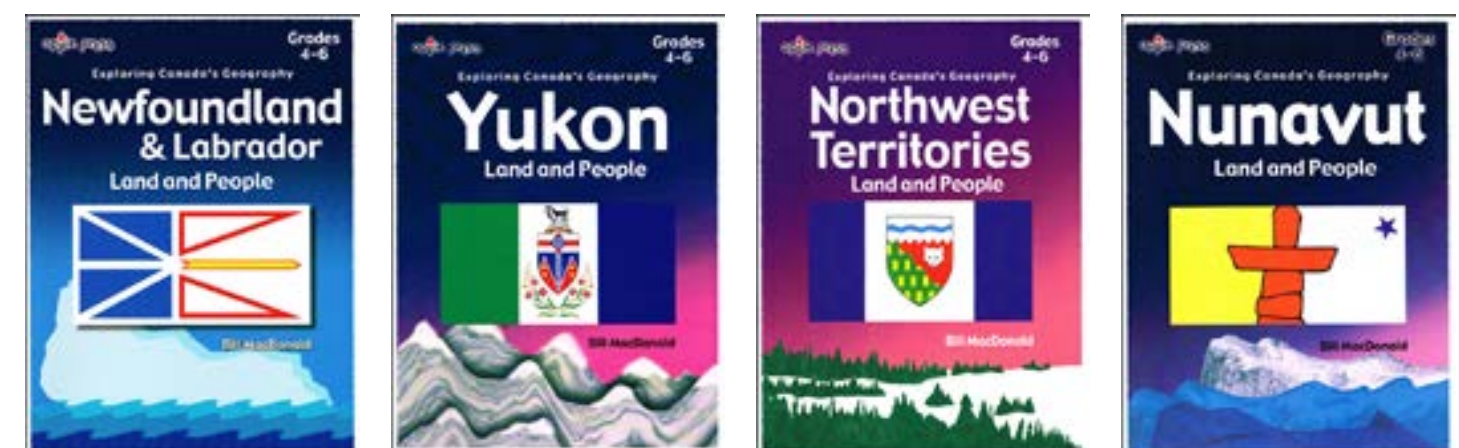

The tallgrass prairie is the natural vegetation across much of south-central Manitoba, including the Red River Valley. This zone lies between the moist, deciduous forests to the east and the dry, short-grass prairie to the west. At one time, this tall sea of grass stretched south of Lake Winnipeg to the Mississippi and covered a million square kilometres. The original tallgrass _____ provided food and shelter for countless insects, birds and animals.

About 40 different plant species make up the tallgrass prairie. Some of the grasses, such as big bluestem, grow more than two metres high. Other hardy and colourful tallgrass _____ include wildflowers such as goldenrods, asters and blazing stars. To survive long, dry periods during growth, the plants produce abundant long and thin _____ that go deep into the ground.

The early settlers quickly realized that the fertile _____ beneath the tallgrass prairie produced excellent crops of wheat and other grains. The land was also easy to plow. By 1900, much of the original landscape was converted to farmland and much of the natural _____ were destroyed. Now only small, scattered patches of the original tallgrass prairie remain.
